College of Business Education (CBE) Partners with Tanzania Red Cross Society for First Aid Training

Student Health and Safety is a top priority in universities, enabling students to maintain good health and safety as they pursue an education aligned with the job market during their time at college.

The College of Business Education (CBE), in collaboration with the Tanzania Red Cross Society, organized and conducted hands-on First Aid training to equip participants with the skills to assist individuals experiencing health emergencies, reducing risks before hospital transfer. This three-day training aimed to build the capacity of Social Welfare Officers from all CBE campuses, enabling them to administer First Aid to CBE students in case of health challenges.

CBE continues to organize diverse capacity-building training sessions for its staff and students through partnerships with various governmental and private institutions, enhancing the effectiveness of education delivery and skill development.

The College of Business Education (CBE) concluded its Health Week with a commemoration of World AIDS Day on December 1, 2023.

Health Week began on Monday, November 27, 2023, featuring various health stakeholders, including the Office of the Chief



Medical Officer of Dar es Salaam City, Agha Khan Hospital, Damu Salama, and UTT AMIS. The week



was organized by the college management in collaboration with the Student Government (CBESO).

Activities included HIV testing, screenings for breast and cervical cancer, family planning services, non-communicable disease awareness, and safe blood donation.

In her closing speech, Dr. Zaituni Hamza, Chief Medical Officer of Dar es Salaam City, encouraged students to prioritize their health by avoiding risky behaviors such as



unprotected sex, abortion, and drug use. She also urged them to focus on their studies and strive to gain skills and expertise in their fields. The event concluded with the distribution of bed nets and condoms to students, provided by the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Dar es Salaam City to help protect the health of young people.

He emphasized the importance of such education for bus attendants, particularly for enhancing road safety. He noted that this training would also promote respect and professionalism among bus attendants, comparable to that of airline attendants.

CBE Rector, Prof. Edda Lwoga, explained that the training would be conducted practically



over a period of 10 days, with sessions lasting 6 hours each day. She added that CBE is one of only two institutions in the country offering specialized training for bus attendants. The training will be delivered in the national language to ensure accessibility for all attendees.

The representative of the Director General of LATRA, Mr. Johanes Kahatano, highlighted how this training would help bus attendants



tackle challenges such as managing accidents and improving passenger service quality.



The launch event was attended by heads of various institutions. including police representatives, government officials, and key transport stakeholders. Among the attendees were the LATRA Director General's representative Mr. Johanes Kahatano, Regional Police Commander representative ACP Michael Deleli, TABOA Chairperson Mr. Abdallah Muhamad Kiongozi, Fire and Rescue Force representative Ms. Pilli Kaku, BASATA Executive

Mpogolo made these remarks on October 23, 2024, at the CBE Main Campus Hall in Dar es Salaam, during the closing of a three-day training provided by the College free of charge as a part of its community outreach program. He expressed his support for these efforts and his willingness to collaborate so that this knowledge reaches those who missed out on this round of training.

"You are providing business education, but these women are living that education; they sustain their livelihoods through business. We appreciate you for teaching us how to enhance our businesses, including improving standards and adding value. I urge the College to consider the bodaboda (motorcycle taxi) operators who are also doing business alongside these women," said Hon. Mpogolo.



On her part, CBE Rector, Prof. Edda Tandi Lwoga, said that CBE's mission and goals include providing business education and reaching out to small-scale entrepreneurs, especially women and youth, to stimulate economic growth and business development in the country. She noted that similar training sessions will be extended to entrepreneurs in other regions, including Dodoma, Mwanza, and Mbeya, in November 2024.

"Entrepreneurs have learned and improved various marketing strategies, social media usage, customer service professionalism, and business planning. I thank all the participants and assure them that this is just the beginning; we will return with tailored programs to meet specific needs," said Prof. Lwoga.

If you're experiencing any of the challenges discussed here today, don't face it alone. Come, and let us help you," she concluded.

Vice President Calls for Enhanced Investment in Education and Distance Learning at the College of Business Education

On July 31, 2023, the Vice President of the United Republic of Tanzania, Hon. Dr. Philip Isdor Mpango, urged the leadership of the College of Business Education (CBE) in Mbeya to invest more in distance learning systems. This investment is intended to enable more young people, particularly those in remote areas, to take educational advantage of opportunities in business, including those available both locally and internationally.

Dr. Mpango made these remarks during the inauguration of the CBE Mbeya Campus and its buildings. He spoke to hundreds of residents from the Iganzo ward in Mbeya City, who gathered in large numbers to witness this historic event.

He emphasized that it is now time for CBE lecturers to keep pace with current trends in education to better



assist students in obtaining knowledge and skills relevant to modern business practices. "The leadership of the college should develop plans that will enable this institution to provide quality business education for the broader interests of the nation and the development of our country," he stated.

With this new investment, he called on the lecturers to consider offering education on modern business systems to enhance competitiveness both domestically and internationally.

He also informed the college's Patron, the

Speaker of the National Assembly and Member of Parliament for Mbeya Urban, Hon. Dr. Tulia Ackson, that he had heard her request regarding educational infrastructure and road improvements, promising to communicate it to the relevant

ministers.

College's Governing Board, Prof. Wineaster Anderson, reported that the construction of the college has cost 1.4 billion Tanzanian shillings, with 1.1 billion shillings sourced from internal revenue and 350 million shillings from the central

government fund. He added that in the first phase, they have received 12,000 students, with plans to increase that number to 20,000 in the future.
